

Dr. Arnold Bierman's innovation is noted; named to committee

Dr. Arnold Bierman, 2302 North Broad Street, Lansdale, has been appointed to the Eye Care Quality Assurance Committee of U.S. Healthcare. Dr. Bierman was recognized for his innovative use of yoked prisms in the treatment of reading and concentration problems.



Dr. Bierman began his practice in Lansdale in 1968. He specializes in treating children and adults with reading problems. Bierman graduated With honors from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1968. He served as a faculty member of the College from 1968 to 1979, first as a Clinical Instructor, and then as an Assistant Professor, teaching courses in case analysis and clinical optometry. Dr. Bierman also served as visual consultant to Mont-

gomery County Intermediate Unit's Pre-school screening program for physically handicapped children from 1976 to 1987.

Dr. Bierman has been a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry since 1972. He is a member of the Beta Sigma Kappa International Honor Society, as well as the American Optometric Association, Pennsylvania Optometric Association, Bucks - Montgomery Optometric Society, Optometric Extension Program (OEPF), and the College of Optometrists & Visual Development (COVD). He served as President of the Eastern PA Chapter of the American Academy of Optometry from 1978 to 1980, and has been listed in "Who's Who In The East". Dr. Bierman has had letters and articles published in numerous optometric journals, and has lectured extensively on children's reading and learning problems to parent groups and school systems throughout the North Penn area.
